Graciousness and appreciation. In this last week past, a cherished parent who catalogues and organises our new library books, walked into the primary classroom. The directress there had just shown the children a new spelling dictionary donated at the school's 'language arts evening'. She was delighted when overhearing the children's discussion and enthusiasm over the benefits of the dictionary. One boy specifically asked who had donated the book, demonstrating true appreciation for the donor.

As in this example, do children naturally demonstrate graciousness, which is seen a how they are with themselves and others and do children naturally demonstrate appreciation? You may say, yes very young children do show honest appreciation for most things around them, but somehow it can become lost quickly, especially when showing appreciation or gratitude is tied to rewards.



The very foundation of a Montessori environment at no matter what age group; is "graces and courtesies." As directors in these environments it is without a doubt the very essence that is expected in ensuring support in the development of the young child to adulthood. Can we force children to be kind and respectful? No we can't. But what we can do in our every moment when with children and others is consistently demonstrate graciousness and appreciation. This is exactly what children do, they re-enact your behaviour. These graces and courtesies are there to build necessary social skills to carry throughout their lives and all relationships.


UPDATE TO PARENTS:

Independent schools (primary 6-12 years) that offer alternate curricula, such as Montessori schools; Umalusi and the affected parties have a formal agreement on the approach that Umalusi would take in accrediting these schools.

We are awaiting the outcome of the proposed meeting between the Department of Basic Education (DBE), South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) and the Council for Quality Assurance in general and further education and training (UMALUSI) to discuss the accreditation of schools that offer alternate and foreign curricula.

At present and until such time as a solution has been found by Umalusi to find a solution for themselves to accredit our schools; the delivery of an authentic Montessori programme will continue, as per our rights as independent schools, unaffected by the restrictions of compliance to CAPS. Our responsibility though, as Montessori schools is to ensure we have sound understanding of educational requirements for our children.

We are pleased that for SAMA member preschools, SAMA has formed a partnership with the Independent Quality Assurance Association (IQAA) in bringing about an independent quality evaluation process developed specifically for Montessori schools! 'Montessori Pre-schools in a Mirror' (guideline instrument for internal evaluation of Montessori pre-schools).
